The theme of the congress is “The footprint of ethnopharmacology in drug discovery”. The congress focuses on current topics and future prospects in the study of traditional systems of medicine and the ethnopharmacology of natural drugs worldwide.

These collaborations can further contribute to the generation of new intellectual property, increase human capacity development in the STEM fields and provide a pathway for African researchers to contribute to the National Development Plan, Sustainable Development Goals and the African Union Agenda 2063.

In order, to highlight the importance of Traditional African Medicine and its impact in today's medicine, the International Society for Ethnopharmacology (ISE) has partnered with the newly founded African Phytomedicine Scientific Society (APSS). The APSS aims to serve as a collaborative African research network on medicinal plants and natural products.



The ISE is an international, collaborative, interdisciplinary group of scientists including anthropologists, pharmacists, pharmacologists, ethnobotanists, phytochemists, and other researchers, all fascinated by the study of the global use of traditional and natural medicines. The ISE is particularly concerned with understanding the use of drugs derived from plants, animals and inorganic materials by traditional societies and the cultural and pharmacological dimensions of medicinal plant use worldwide. The society has an official ISI-accredited journal, which is the "The Journal of Ethnopharmacology (Publisher - Elsevier), with a current (2023) impact factor of 5.4 (<https://www.sciencedirect.com/journal/journal-of-ethnopharmacology>).

The APSS provides a platform highlighting research on Africa's rich biocultural diversity and the output of world-class African researchers, with the aim of fostering the collaboration within Africa and advancing research on the African continent. ISE and APSS encourage the participation of all role-players and stake holders in the production chain, from the initial survey of traditional medicines used by health practitioners to the final stage of pharmaceutical development by the industry. APSS will encompass a multi-disciplinary effort to provide, connect and promote phytomedicinal research and development on the African continent.
